




#### The nonprofit bottom line is a better community

There are more nonprofits per 1,000 people in Nebraska than in the United States. Most are human service focused and located in larger counties across the state.








#### Nonprofits have an economic ripple effect on Nebraska

Nonprofit revenue, expenses, and assets have all increased over time. However, the majority (56%) of nonprofits are still operating with less than \$250,000 in net assets.

### Nonprofits create mission-driven jobs for Nebraskans

Nonprofits employed 90,000+ people (1 in 11) and paid \$3.9B in wages in 2015, up 20% from 2010. Nonprofit median wages were higher than for-profit and government.
