




The nonprofit bottom line is a better community

There are more nonprofits per 1,000 people in Nebraska than in the United States. Most are human service focused and located in larger counties across the state.




Nonprofits per 1,000 People






Nonprofits have an economic ripple effect on Nebraska

Nonprofit revenue, expenses, and assets have all increased over time. However, the majority (56%) of nonprofits are still operating with less than \$250,000 in net assets.






Nonprofits create mission-driven jobs for Nebraskans

Nonprofits employed 90,000+ people (1 in 11) and paid \$3.9B in wages in 2015, up 20% from 2010. Nonprofit median wages were higher than for-profit and government.

Myth busted...nonprofits do pay taxes

Despite common misperceptions, nonprofits and their employees pay a variety of taxes. Nonprofits paid over \$263 million in payroll taxes alone.

The nonprofit impact highlighted throughout this document wouldn't be possible if not for the generous nature of Nebraskans and grantmaking foundations.

There are **575** foundations that granted over \$1.0 billion in 2015, which is a **72%** increase from 2010.



Nebraska is the 6th highest ranked state for volunteerism across the nation.

84% of Nebraskans report charitable contributions averaging \$5,264.
